





Heifers were the first animals Heifer International used to help hungry families. Dairy cows can give as much as four gallons of milk a day, and milk can be used to make cheese, butter or yogurt, and the extra milk can be sold for income. Cows also provide manure that enriches the soil. A heifer is a young female cow. There is perhaps no more meaningful gift than a heifer.

- It is a gift of milk every morning for a malnourished child.
- It is a gift of up to four gallons of milk a day so an anxious parent can sell the extra to pay for their child's food, clothes, school and medicine.

The Angelus is a devotion that enables its users to commemorate the incarnation three times a day – at dawn, at noon, and at sunset. Originally it was prayed only in the evening, with the tolling of the "Ave Maria"bell. In the 13th century the dawn and noon bells were added. Our church bells ring the Angelus each day at 6, noon and at 6.

From the Pastor's Desk

Over on the Breaux Bridge highway sits a rather simple yet beautiful building which houses the Monastery of Mary, Mother of Grace. For decades now, this community of vowed Carmelite women has offered prayer to God, and offered their very lives in devotion to that life of prayer. On this Second Sunday of Advent, I offer you words from the sisters' letter announcing their novena in preparation for the Feast of Christmas:

"During this time we will need to keep our gaze fixed upon Jesus Christ, the 'pioneer and perfecter of our faith' (Heb 12:2): in Him all the anguish and all the longing of the human heart finds fulfillment. The joy of love, the answer to the drama of suffering and pain, the power of forgiveness in the face of an offence received and the victory of life over the emptiness of death; all this finds fulfillment in the mystery of the Incarnation, in His becoming man, in His sharing our human weakness so as to transform it by the power of His resurrection." (from Pope Benedict's 'Porto Fidei', n. 13)

The "time" of which our Holy Father speaks is the Year of Faith we are currently celebrating. But his words can also be applied to the feast of Christmas, the birthday of this "pioneer and perfecter of our faith".

What do we mean when we call Jesus the "pioneer of our faith"? A pioneer is one who goes before, who prepares the way for others. Jesus became incarnate and entered into this world to go before us as a flawless example of how a true child of the Father should act and pray, suffer and love. He is the "perfecter of our faith" because His life, suffering and death show us how to live in order to bring faith to its completion and fulfillment. The Little One whom we cherish at Christmas is truly the joy, the answer, the power and the victory of human lie. Faith in Him should be "the lifelong companion that makes it possible to perceive, ever anew, the marvels that God works for us" (Porta Fidei, 15) in the gift of His divine Son to the world and to each of us personally.

At the center of the Christmas mystery is Mary, the Virgin Mother . . . She is blessed because she believed even in the darkness of God's mysterious and inexplicable demands. By her faith Mary gave God the means to become flesh and dwell among us. By her faith Mary furnished us the model and means to receive this God made flesh and to accept Him enfolded in the obscurity and darkness of His designs for us. . . . Mary is both the Treasury and the Treasure of God's riches, of which the greatest is Jesus himself.

This is the great mystery which we prepare to celebrate. May we prepare well.
