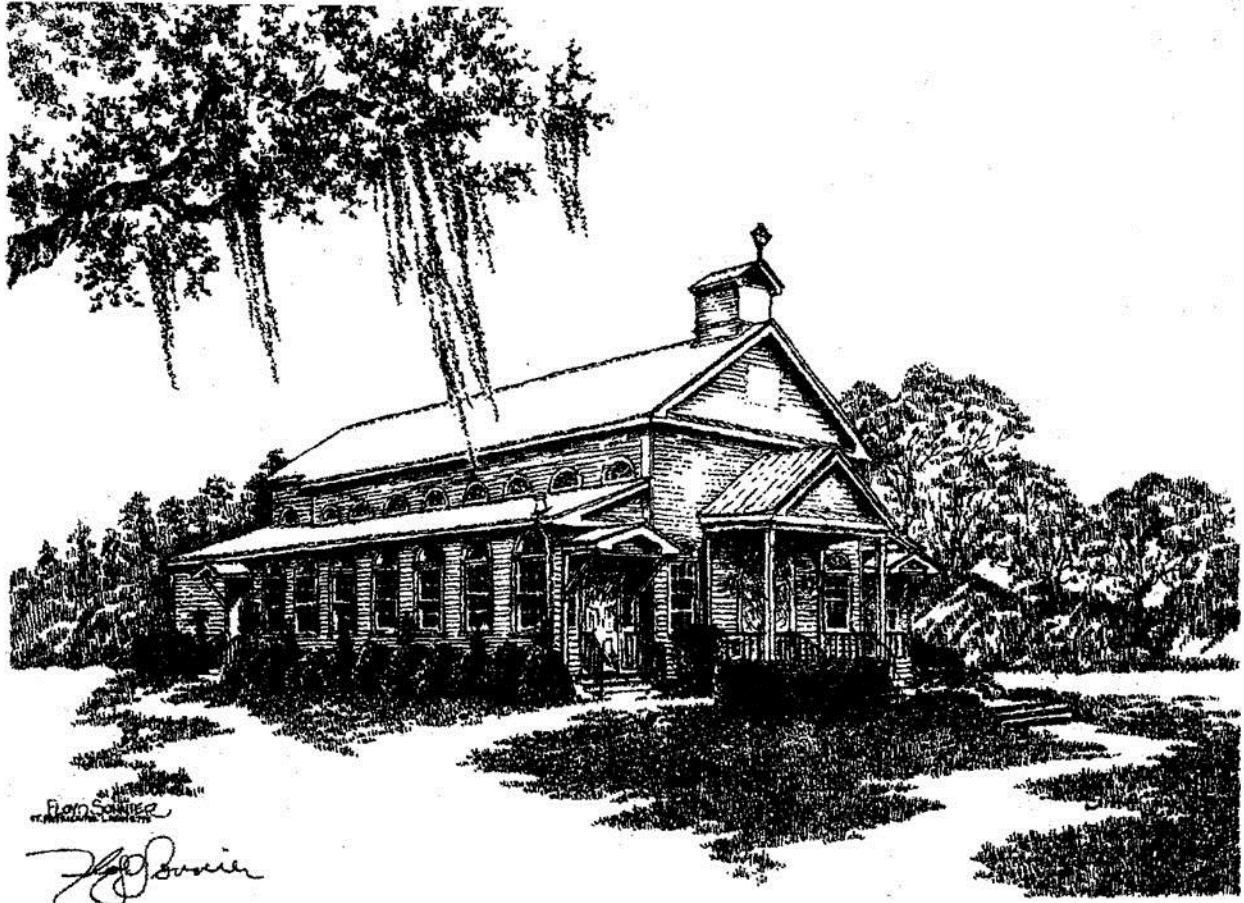

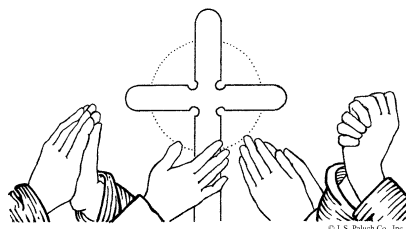

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From the Pastor's Desk

Last week I started speaking about some things that may not be what they seem to be, offering some guidance on the topic of “private revelation”. Particularly when it comes to religious faith, truth is important. The goal in all of this is to make fruitful use of what is good, while not being led astray by false belief.

That leads me to a sign I happened to notice several times recently when driving on the Evangeline Thruway here in town. You may have noticed as well a sign for “Christ the King Catholic Church”, advertising a Latin Mass. The word that stood out for me was “Catholic”. Anyone seeing that sign would probably assume that this is simply one of the parishes of the Diocese of Lafayette. Several years ago, Bishop Jarrell clarified the situation as follows:

“Some confusion has arisen concerning the status of Christ the King Church located at 510 Northwest Evangeline Thruway in Lafayette. It is my duty to inform all Catholics that Christ the King Church is not in communion with the Catholic Church. It possesses no canonical status in the Church, and therefore its priests do not exercise legitimate ministries in the Church. Catholics who wish to remain in communion with the Church are not to participate in services at Christ the King Church, except in those rare circumstances provided for in Church law. One's pastor should be consulted. Catholics who wish to celebrate the sacraments according to the older extraordinary form, (in Latin) are invited to attend the Latin Mass, which is fully approved, at Saint Peter Catholic Church in Carencro on Sundays at 1:00 p.m. The separation among Christians is a sad, but real condition in our world. Let us all pray and work appropriately in a true spirit of ecumenism for a day when all followers of Jesus will be fully united in faith and practice.”

Since it has been several years since this statement was issued by the Bishop, I offer it for those who may be unaware of the irregular status of this community, particularly because Christ the King advertises itself as “Catholic” in a way that will be confusing to many. Because even the validity of the sacraments there is questionable, Catholics who might attend should know that what they receive may not even be the Eucharist.

As the Bishop says, such divisions are sad, but real. Ignoring the divisions (e.g., “Well, we all worship the same god.”) does not move us toward true unity. In addition, all Catholic activities within the Diocese of Lafayette are intended to be under the pastoral care of the local bishop. For a group of Catholics to attempt to engage in the work of the Church independently of the local Bishop is contradictory at best, reflects a poor understanding of Church, and can easily lead to more division. The People of God deserve better.
