

1. THE 293 St. Augustine and the Dawn of the Christian Era 3 sem. hours

Fr. Clinton Sensat, STL

Description: St. Augustine is the most quoted saint in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, and without doubt the most influential figure in Western theology. This course will examine his life and teaching, investigating in a topical manner both his major works and his major controversies. Attention will be paid as well not only to Augustine as a historical figure, but to his continuing influence on the Church today.





1. THE 203 - Jesus, Son of God 3 sem. hours

Description: This course is a study of the person and mission of Jesus Christ. This course focuses on Jesus as portrayed in the Gospels, the early controversies and councils about the person and nature of Christ, as well as Christological developments in the Medieval, Reformation, and Modern eras, and especially after the Second Vatican Council. Classes may be taught in an in-class, hybrid, or online format. Some designated hybrid and online courses have set times that require virtual participation. (May be taught concurrently with THE 604)


